Policy Statement

At Durrell, we welcome everyone to enjoy time at Jersey Zoo connecting to wildlife and learning about conservation.

We aim to create an experience that is accessible for people of all needs and abilities. To help us achieve this we work with local people and specialist organisations to learn how we can improve, and make positive changes to ensure every visitor has a wonderful experience.

From January 2021 any visitor with a disability will be required to purchase the relevant adult, child or concession admission ticket. Jersey Zoo provides the option to admit essential carers FREE of charge.

This policy is in place to:

- Establish consistent messaging and communication across entry to Jersey Zoo for visitors and members.
- Ensure fair and considerate measures are taken to enable carers to access the site to support individuals with a disability
- Aligning membership policy with visitor policy for people with disabilities to access Jersey Zoo

What is classed as a concession?

Concession means a Senior Citizen, Student, registered disabled, valid proof is required. Senior Citizen means a person aged from 65 years old. Student means a person who is in full time education.

What is classed as a disability?

Disability means a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long-term negative effect on a person's ability to do normal daily activities within the meaning of the Equality Act 2010.

Under the law, disability is a long-term impairment which can affect a person's ability to participate or engage in activities such as:

- Work
- Eating out
- Shopping

- Staying in a hotel or any other area of life covered by the law.

An impairment may be physical, mental, intellectual or sensory. Employers and service providers should think broadly about a range of impairments, such as:

- mobility impairments, including stick users and wheelchair users
- visual impairments
- hearing impairments
- limited dexterity, e.g. arthritis
- mental health
- learning difficulties
- autism

To qualify as 'long-term', the impairment must last, or be expected to last, for six months or more (or for the rest of the individual's life).

Who is classed as a carer?

Carer means a person who accompanies a disabled person for the purpose of providing them necessary support and assistance with accessibility to the Zoo. A maximum of one carer is permitted to enter Jersey Zoo free of charge when accompanying someone with additional needs unless arranged in advance with the Visitor Centre supervisor.

Determining Eligibility

Verification could be in the form of a blue badge, a letter from a recognised authority such as Doctor, Health and Social Services, Jersey registered Charity or a Nimbus Card, DID or Access Card, Avanchi Card (Liberty Bus).

These options must be supported by photo ID.

Once verification has been received, of carer will be able to access Jersey Zoo FREE of charge with the visitor with disability.

Accessibility

Most areas of the site are accessible by wheelchair and pushchair via pathways. Shopmobility motorised scooters (£10) and wheelchairs (£6) are available to hire at the Visitor Centre entrance. Blue Badges

If you plan to show your blue badge at the entrance, the blue badge will need to be taken back to your car afterwards to authenticate your parking in a disabled parking bay. (Please note that limited Disabled car parking spaces are available.)

For Visitors with Assistance Dogs

Dogs are not currently permitted on site at Jersey Zoo, with the exception of assistance dogs under specific conditions, with following rules we ask you to follow. Please bring all necessary paperwork relating to the animal and its role, without this entry may not be permitted.

- Dogs must be wearing a harness and never left unattended
- Your dog must remain calm and quiet, away from enclosure fronts where possible.
- Our animals and dogs can react to each other. If you notice any behavioural changes of concern, please move on to another exhibit.

- Dogs are not permitted in any of our walkthrough areas which includes Jewels of the Forest, the lemur pontoon, Butterfly Kaleidoscope, Kirindy aviary or behind the scenes areas.
- Some of our animals are free-ranging within the zoo - please keep your dog under control and away from these.
- Your dog must be fit and healthy when visiting the zoo, and not show any signs of ill health – including diarrhoea and vomiting – in the last 24 hours. They must have been resident in Jersey or the UK for the last 6 months and have received all annual vaccinations and anthelmintic treatments.
- You must clean up after your dog.

Accessible Toilets

Accessible toilets are located:

- Firefly café at the Visitor Centre
- The Dodo café in the centre of Jersey Zoo
- Next to Butterfly Kaleidoscope

Notes-

Concession means a Senior Citizen, Student, or registered disabled, valid proof is required.

- Senior Citizen means a person aged from 65 years old
- Student means a person who is in full time education, this could be Jersey, UK or International. A valid Student ID Card that is in date must be validated each year to gain entry or register a membership.
- Disability means a physical or mental impairment that has a substantial and long-term negative effect on a person's ability to do normal daily activities within the meaning of the Equality Act 2010.
- Carer means a person who accompanies a Disabled person for the purpose of providing them necessary support and assistance with accessibility to the Zoo. A maximum of one carer is permitted to enter free of charge when accompanying someone with additional needs, unless prearranged in advance.
