



JOB PURPOSE

To assist the Head of Veterinary Services and Associate Vets in the provision of medical services in support of the Trust's operations, in maintaining the highest standards of animal health and welfare and in ensuring compliance with local, national and international regulations. This is a broad veterinary role including the day-to-day veterinary care of the animal collection, provision of a gross pathology service, research and publication, teaching and development of lectures and courses, training and supervision of students, and contribution to conservation programmes.

WORKING CONDITIONS

Basic hours for the post are 41.5 hours a week; However, flexibility is required as department operates 365/6 days a year with 24hr cover. The post holder will be required to work as part of the department duty rota, which includes weekend working and providing on call cover; and to work any additional hours necessary to satisfactorily fulfil the responsibilities of the post.



KEY RESPONSIBILITES

GENERAL AND CLINICAL DUTIES:

- To work as part of the veterinary team in in maintaining the highest standards of medical care of the animal collection and in the provision of twenty-four-hour cover.
- To keep and analyse full and accurate records and to communicate findings to veterinary and animal staff through established channels.
- To maximise the collection of clinical data and pathological material and to contribute to maintenance of archives.
- To contribute to the Veterinary Services department's research and scientific output through original research projects.
- To assist the veterinary team in supporting the Trust's overseas projects as required.

DUTIES:

- To ensure compliance with all relevant local and international regulations, including C.I.T.E.S., pertaining
 to animal health, welfare, and disease management. To comply with regulatory controls and institution
 policy with regard to biological specimens and veterinary drugs and materials.
- To promote programmes for veterinary healthcare and disease control and advise on actual and potential disease outbreaks.
- To undertake medical and surgical procedures so as to maximise the health and appropriate reproductive success of the animal collection.
- To carry out postmortem examinations and follow diagnosis through to conclusion.
- To keep up to date with current best practice and maintain a programme of continued professional development.
- To keep up to date with relevant health and veterinary legislation and advise measures to ensure compliance.
- To assist with specific clinical and research investigations conducted in the collection and contribute directly to such investigations as necessary.
- To assist, with guidance, in the department's laboratory providing diagnostic workup on clinical cases.
- To work alongside and guide volunteers, trainees or veterinary students working within the department.
- To ensure that high standards of hygiene and cleanliness are maintained throughout the veterinary facilities.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILL AND ABILITY

QUALIFICATIONS

The post holder is required to be registered in the Royal Court of Jersey and must therefore be a registered member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (i.e., licensed to practice as a vet in the UK).

This post is designed for new vets looking to gain experience and understanding of zoological medicine (or experienced vets seeking to try a different field). Although training will be provided, this is not a formal residency program.


PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE AND SKILLS

- The post holder must be a team player and be able to work unsupervised in a multidisciplinary environment.


