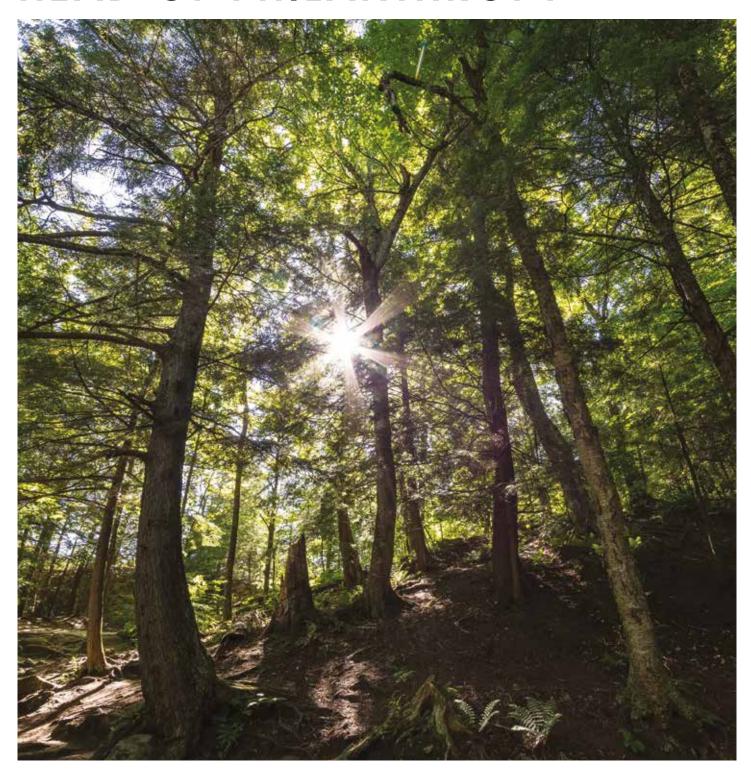

PURPOSEFUL

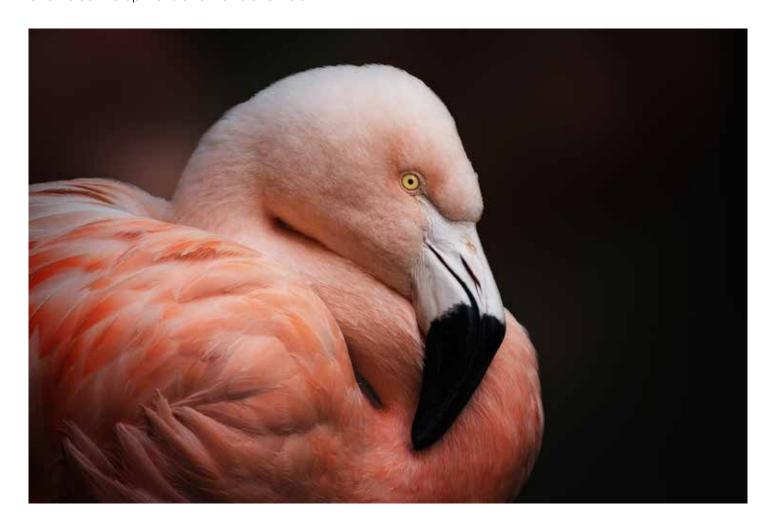

JOB PURPOSE

We are excited to be recruiting a Head of Philanthropy, to continue the development of our successful major donor fundraising programme and manage and develop the existing Philanthropy Team.

This crucial fundraising role is essential to support Durrell's rewilding programmes around the world and also developments at Jersey Zoo.

The main purpose of this role is to secure major gifts from individual donors as well as some trusts and foundations. The Head of Philanthropy will develop and manage strong relationships with major donors and secure fundraising income to set targets. This role is also responsible for managing the existing Philanthropy Team, which includes a Philanthropy Manager with a focus on mid-level donors, a Trust and Grants Fundraiser and a Legacy Manager.

The Head of Philanthropy will have experience of securing five and six figure gifts from individuals and family foundations, a solid basis in relationship fundraising, as well as a good understanding of data, research, donor stewardship and communications. The post-holder will also have had experience of managing a team.

As a member of the Fundraising Team, the Head of Philanthropy will contribute towards the creation and delivery of the charity's strategic, operational, and departmental plans.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

FUNDRAISING

- Lead the major donor programme by engaging potential and existing supporters, providing emotional reward and evidence of impact; be the principal contact for potential and existing major donors.
- Build relationships, understand motivations, and secure five and six figure donations to support Durrell's mission across all operational pillars (Rewilding Sites, Jersey Zoo, Science and Training).
- Create effective donor pathways and provide exemplary stewardship to build rapport with donors, including, but not exclusively, face to face meetings, introductions to key staff members, meeting new species, invitations to events, opportunities for in kind support also donations.
- Effective use of CRM database (RE NXT), ensuring all records relating to major donors are up to date, enabling effective reporting of pipeline and monitoring of portfolio.
- Use data to shape personalised approaches to HNWs and UHNWS and to build successful relationships that yield long term support rather than one-off gifts.
- Provide regular, personal, and engaging communications, updates and reports to all existing and potential donors.
- Develop strong internal relationship with senior stakeholders, to identify opportunities for philanthropic support. Work collaboratively with mission delivery teams to prepare funding proposals.
- Research high net worth individuals as well as trusts and foundations to identify opportunities and build a robust pipeline to ensure sustainable income for supporting Durrell's work.
- Work with wider fundraising team on planning and implementing integrated fundraising or capital campaigns.

EVENTS

- Support the management and administration of events both in UK and Jersey in coordination with the Events Manager, and Director of Communications and Fundraising. This would include building invitation lists, creating copy, sending invitations and monitoring replies and also, follow up post events and contribution to evaluation.
- Look for opportunity to develop ideas for new events to engage and steward existing donors and new prospects.

PHILANTHROPY TEAM MANAGEMENT

- Lead the Philanthropy Team, by providing support, mentorship, and direction.
- Work together to develop mutually beneficial relationships and achieve income targets and goals.
- Collaboratively work with Trusts & Grants fundraiser on best approach to Family Foundations.
- Support Philanthropy Manager on the development of a mid-level giving programme to support the major donor pipeline.
- Provide support and guidance to the Legacy Manager to continue the development of the legacy marketing programme.
- Provide regular, personal, and engaging communications, updates and reports to all existing and potential donors.

OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES

- Work with the fundraising and communications team to identify potential new fundraising opportunities including fundraising platforms, communications channels and products
- To provide support to the Director of Communications & Fundraising, including any other activity deemed necessary to conform to the requirements of the Trust.
- Work closely with the Head of Fundraising regarding on a collaborative approach to ensure major donor prospects are identified
- Be a passionate ambassador for DWCT, always maintaining the highest level of professionalism.
- Contribute to the wider Fundraising team, taking a proactive approach to working in a high-performing and collaborative environment.

- Accountable for own responsibilities.

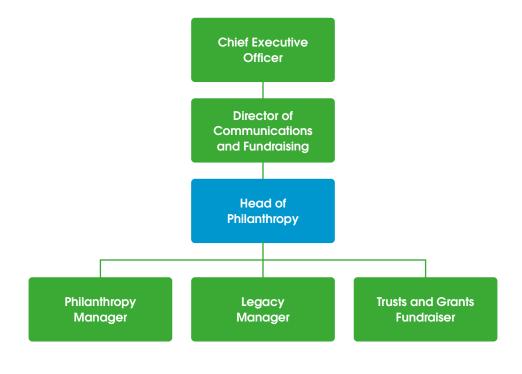


KNOWLEDGE, SKILL AND ABILITY

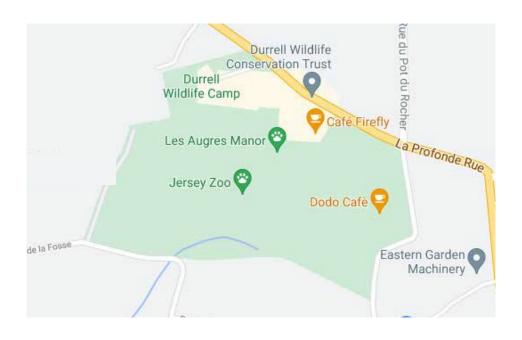
- Minimum of five years' experience face-to-face fundraising, with an excellent track record of successfully securing five and six figure donations.
